# $\text{AIM}^{\mathbb{G}}$ Train the Trainers not required

# Holds a current GIC qualification

- Observes the teaching of an AIM course prior to joining the faculty
- Teaches on minimum 2 AIM days per year to maintain instructor status

Holds a teaching qualification and regularly teaches on clinical courses

- Observes the teaching of an AIM course prior to joining the faculty
- Teaches on minimum 2 AIM days per year to maintain instructor status

Is considered by local AIM Lead to have full and recent experience at teaching on clinical courses

### $AIM^{\mathbb{C}}$ Train the Trainers required

#### Has past experience of teaching on clinical courses but is considered by local AIM Lead to need a "refresher"

- Instructor Potential form to be completed, signed, and sent to Skills Institute with a request for a place on AIM Train the Trainers
  Purchase Order to be raised and sent to Skills
- Institute to invoice against •Local AIM Lead arranges for candidate to
- observe the teaching of an AIM course prior to attending AIM Train the Trainers
- Post-Train the Trainers, candidate is eligible to teach on AIM course
- Candidate may complete and return the Train the Trainers Logbook to gain a certificate
- •Teaches on minimum 2 AIM days per year to maintain instructor status

#### Has no teaching qualification/experience but local AIM Lead recognises as having Instructor Potential

- •Attends an AIM course as a candidate and is identified by local AIM Lead as Instructor Potential
- Instructor Potential form to be completed, signed, and sent to Skills Institute with a request for a place on AIM Train the Trainers
- Purchase Order to be raised and sent to Skills Institute to invoice against
- •Local AIM Lead arranges for candidate to observe the teaching of an AIM course prior to attending AIM Train the Trainers
- •Candidate may complete and return the Train the Trainers Logbook to gain a certificate
- Teaches on minimum 2 AIM days per year to maintain instructor status

#### AIM Train the Trainers Logbook/Certificate

- Has attended AIM Train the Trainers at the Skills Institute or an approved TTT Centre
- Completes sections of Logbook as required and submits to Skills Institute within two years
- •Skills Institute verifies Logbook and issues an AIM Train the Trainers certificate
- Candidate will be registered on CCSI central database as a qualified AIM instructor for a period of three years (instructor status can be updated at three years by peer assessment and re-certification by the Skills Institute)
- Candidate teaches on minimum 2 AIM days per year to maintain instructor status
